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ICE STORM SNARLS AIR TRAVEL

Travelers Should Check with Airlines Before Coming to Airport

OKLAHOMA CITY, January 28, 2010 – A major ice and snow storm has caused over 100 flight cancellations today at Will Rogers World Airport with more expected on Friday morning.

About 22 flights departed this morning before the icy weather hit Oklahoma City. But as freezing conditions worsened, airlines cancelled the remaining arriving and departing flights for the day. Many passengers did not travel to the airport and rebooked through the airline's reservations centers.

Because no flights will arrive tonight, early morning flights will be also cancelled. Airlines are anticipating flights to slowly resume operations beginning at about 8:00am.

Airport crews will work through the night to keep runways and taxiways clear and open for operations. The terminal building is open 24 hours a day.

All travelers are advised to check with their airline prior to coming to the airport for flight cancellation status and rebooking.

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Will Rogers World Airport is owned and operated by the City of Oklahoma City Department of Airports. Will Rogers is the city's commercial airport and accommodates over three and a half million passengers each year. The airport services 22 nonstop markets with an average of 75 daily departures. Wiley Post and Clarence E. Page airports are also owned and operated by the City.



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
